Belisha Beacon	The black and white striped poles with flashing orange lights on the top at Zebra crossings.
Buckle	A metal clip used to fasten your seatbelt.
Concentrate	To think hard about something.
Crash	A loud noise or when two vehicles hit each other.
Cycle helmet	A helmet worn by people riding bicycles, to help protect their head in a crash or fall.
Cyclist	A person who rides a bicycle.
Dangerous	When something might hurt or harm you.
Disabled	Having an illness or an injury that makes it difficult to use parts of the body.
Distract	Make someone else stop being careful.
Driver	A person who drives a vehicle.
Fluorescent	Bright or glowing.
Footbridge	A bridge above a busy road where pedestrians can cross safely.
Gap	A space between two things.
Green Cross Code	A special set of rules for crossing the road safely.
Journey	Travelling from one place to another.
Kerb	The edge of the pavement.
Listen	Using ears to really hear something.
Look	To turn your eyes towards something to really see it.
Passenger	Someone who travels in a vehicle, but is not driving it.

Pavement	A path for pedestrians, by the side of the road.
Pedestrian	A person walking.
Pelican crossing	A light-controlled crossing that shows when it is safe to cross, using 'red man' and 'green man' lights.
Reflective	Something that shines light back and can be seen easily.
Route	The way you travel to go from place to place.
School Crossing Patroller	A person who helps children cross the road safely outside school with a special sign to help stop the traffic.
Seatbelt	A fixed strap on car seats that stops people being thrown forward in a crash.
Stop	Finishing doing something; keeping or standing still.
Straight	Not bent or curvy.
Subway	A tunnel under a busy road for pedestrians to use when they want to cross from one side to the other.
Traffic	Vehicles – cars, buses, lorries and bikes all travelling on the road.
Traffic islands	A place in the middle of the road to help pedestrians safely cross wide roads in two halves.
Traveller	A person who is making a journey.
Vehicle	Something that carries people or goods like cars, buses, lorries.
Wheelchair	A special chair with wheels, used by people who are injured or cannot walk.
Zebra crossing	A safer crossing place with black and white stripes on the road and flashing yellow lights.
